

Long radish

Raphanus sativus L. var. niger (Miller) S. Kerner

Hybrid varieties

Sepp, F₁

Half-long selection with hot radish flavour, robust against bolting. Very smooth, white bulb, dark green foliage. This productive variety grows quickly and does not become pithy or ligneous. Very easy to harvest because head is above the soil. High yield.

Lancelot, F₁ (Hi 08 310)

Slender, shiny white Japanese radish with extremely smooth surface and a root length of approx. 40 cm. Stable foliage base, mild taste. Excellent harvesting rates due to outstanding uniformity.

Alois, F₁ (Hi 08 316)

Pure white, long radish hybrid without formation of green head even when overripe. Extremely smooth, approx. 25 cm long, cylindrical root with improved robustness against Verticillium. Barely slit leaves with entire margin. Spicy taste. Suitable for summer cultivation.



Open pollinated varieties

Ostergruß rosa 2/Frühlingsgruß



Bright, dark pinkish, medium-long radish, ideal for bunching. Homogeneous breed for open field and glasshouse production. Standard variety for professional growers. Compact, dark foliage, easy to bunch up.

White Dream

White, half-long, smooth bunching radish for open fields and cultivation under glass. Because of the very homogeneous, cone-shaped form as well as the stable, dark green foliage, White Dream is easy to bunch up. Spicy, white type, similar to Ostergruß.

Rex

Fast-growing, homogeneous, medium-long radish for selling in pieces or as a bunch with low tendency to pithiness. Delicate, spicy taste.

Runder schwarzer Winter (HILD special breeding)



Dark black, round winter radish with very firm flesh. Excellent storability.
